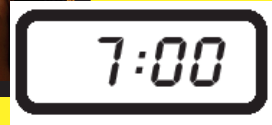
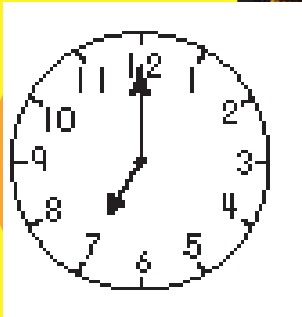




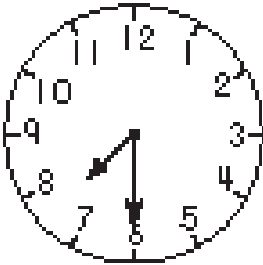
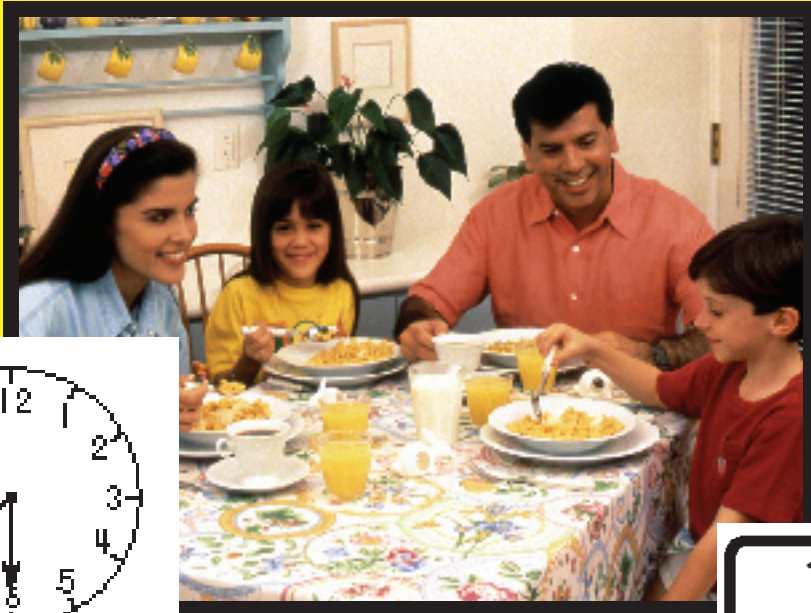
Chapter 1: **Morning**



It is morning. The children on Park Street are busy. They have many things to do. What will they do this morning?

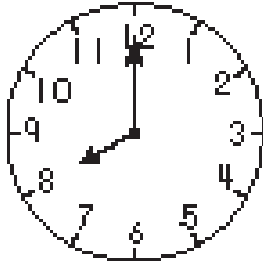


- 🔊 Jenn wakes up at 7:00 in the morning. It is time to get ready for school. She washes her face and brushes her teeth. She gets dressed for school.



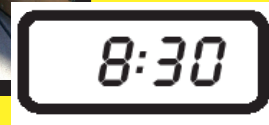
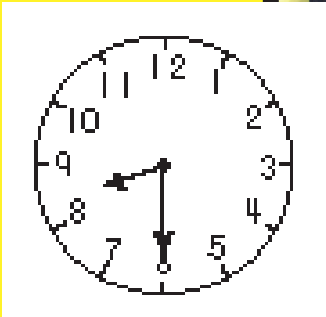

- ▶ Henry has breakfast with his family. They eat at 7:30 in the morning. They have cereal and fruit juice. Henry has milk to drink.

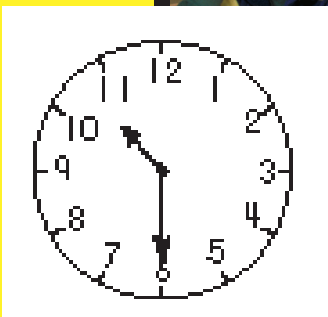


8:00

The children arrive at school. The school bell rings at 8:30 in the morning. The children line up to go to class.



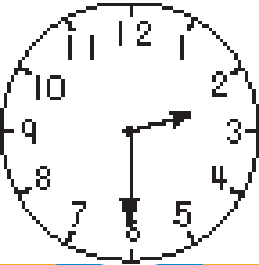
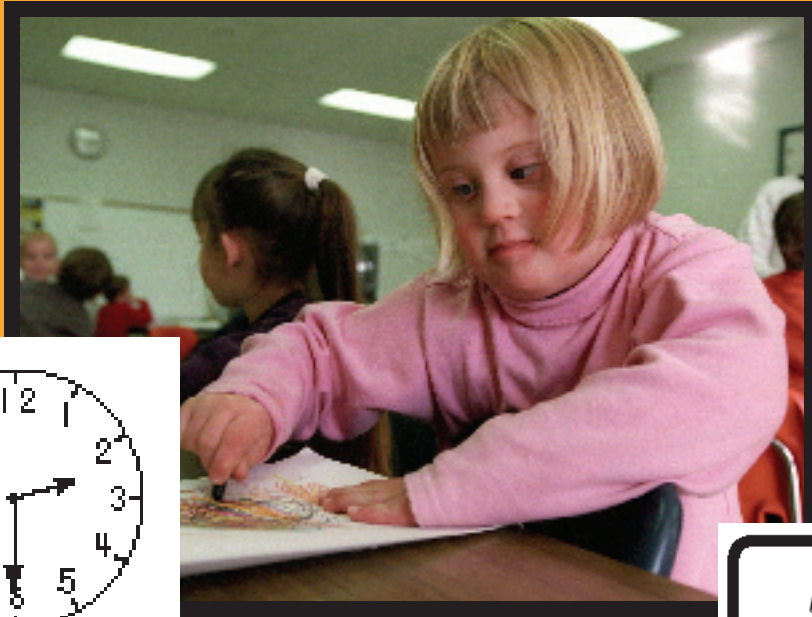
- ▶ In the morning the children work at centers. At 10:30 Jon and Devin work in the math center. They play math games to practice subtraction.



Chapter 2: **Afternoon**

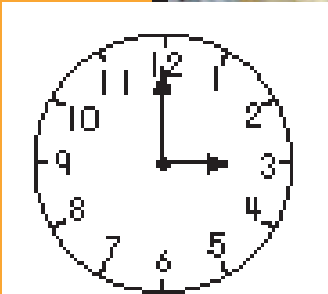
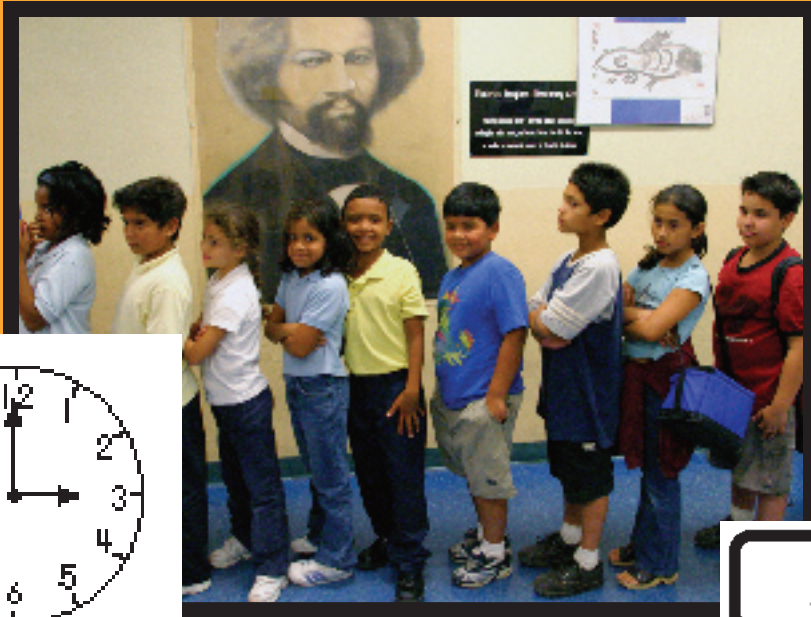


It is afternoon. The children on Park Street are busy. They have many things to do. What will they do this afternoon?

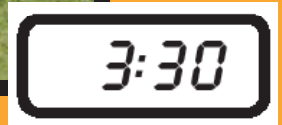
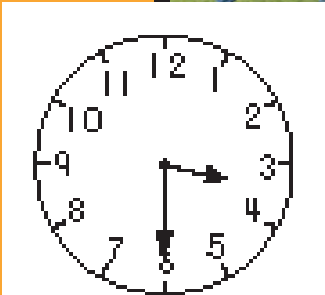

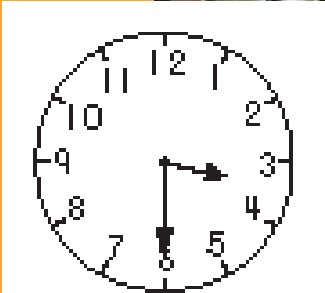
- ▶ The class has art at 2:30 in the afternoon. Today they use crayons and paper to draw pictures.



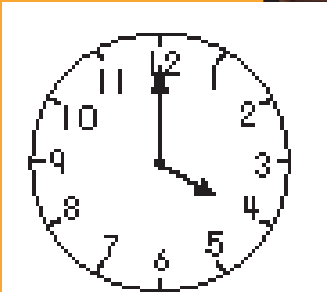
- ▶ The bell rings at 3:00 every afternoon. The children line up to go home. School is over for the day. The children have many things to do after school.



- Some children play soccer after school. They play at the park near the school. Practice starts at 3:30. The children run and play with their friends.



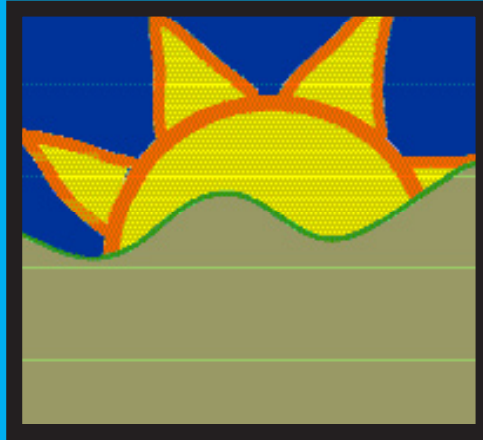
- Other children take music lessons after school. They practice their instruments. They work with the music teacher. Their lessons start at 3:30.



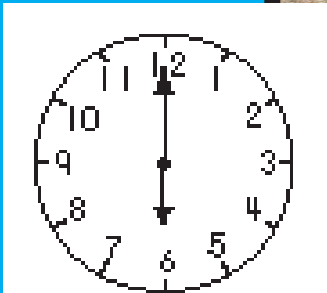
- Many children do their homework after school. Kim begins her homework at 4:00 in the afternoon. She finishes her math. She and some other children pick out books to read.



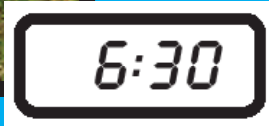
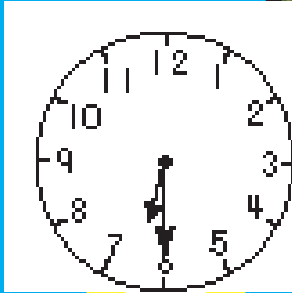
Chapter 3: **Evening**



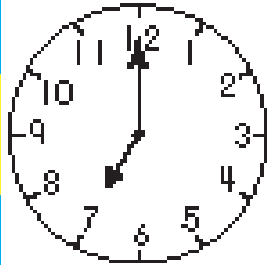
- It is evening. The children on Park Street are busy. They have many things to do. What will they do this evening?

- At 7:00 Tony reads with his family. They read a story together every evening. Tony likes mystery stories. His little brother likes scary books.



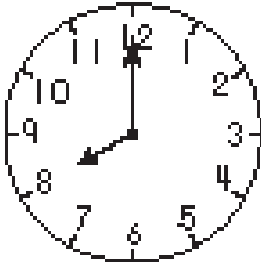
Chapter 4: **Night**



- It is night. The children on Park Street are busy. They have many things to do. What will they do tonight?

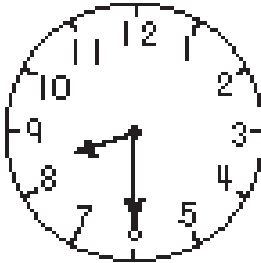


- ▶ Quinton gets ready for bed. He brushes his teeth at 7:30 each night. He puts on his pajamas and says good night to his family.

Glossary

- ▶ **afternoon** the part of day between noon and sunset
- ▶ **evening** the end of the day and the first part of night
- ▶ **morning** the beginning of the day that starts when the sun rises
- ▶ **night** the end of the day after the sun sets
